

QUICK GUIDE TO ASIA RE-OPENING (As of 09 January, 2023)

***Bolded Destinations are “Fully Open” to full vaccinated travelers (at least 2 doses ⁽¹⁾) with no testing, no quarantine, and no travel restrictions.**

(1)- Except in Japan, 2 doses and 1 booster shot are required for entering without covid testing.

China	Partial	China announced late Monday that travelers will no longer need to quarantine upon arrival on the mainland starting Jan. 8 th 2023	Inbound travelers will only be required to show a negative RT-PCR test result obtained within 48 hours before departure. <u>*However, Inbound tourism to China is still not feasible. Now there are three ways for foreigners to enter China:</u> 1) Holding a valid Chinese residence permit for work, study, personal matters, or reunion 2) Holding a diplomatic, service, courtesy, or C visa 3) Holding valid APEC business cards China still only partially opens for foreigners.
